Life has a way of stealing our joy at times. Unwelcomed news, stressful situations, and trying circumstances challenge and affect us all. And often, if we're not careful, our joy in the Lord suffers.

In John 15:11, just hours before He would be betrayed, arrested, and executed, Jesus told His disciples: "I have told you these things so that you will be filled with my joy. Yes, your joy will overflow!" (NLT). What Jesus promised His disciples, and by extension those of us who follow Him today, is a joy that transcends circumstances. A joy that comes only from God's work in us, often in response to our prayers.

The truth is we need God's help to grow into people of joy, and thankfully, our Bibles are full of sample prayers we can learn to pray on our own. After all, if joy is a fruit of God's Spirit in us (Galatians 5:22) and the Father longs for us to bear fruit (John 15:2), won't He be pleased to answer our prayers and grant us joy in Christ?

He certainly will.

So let us confidently ask God to grow us into people of joy, unbothered by mundane írrítatíons and filled with Hís Spírít.

Here are a few biblical prayers you can start praying today:

- 1. Based on Nehemíah 8:10: Your joy ís my
- strength, Lord, so please fill me with Your strength to respond
- with joy even when I'm tíred.
- 2. Based on Psalm 30:5: Though my sorrow may last through this dark night, Your joy will come in the morning. Help me wait patiently for You to turn my tears to laughter.
- 3. Based on Psalm 51:12: Restore to me the joy of Your salvation, Jesus,

and make me quick to obey You.

4. Based on Psalm 4:6-7: Lord, You can fill my heart with more joy that (anything in this life, fill in the blank). I Choose to trust in you!

May we grow in the joy that points us and our world to Jesus.


Sunday school 10:00 am-10:50 am Children's Church 11:00 am – 12:00 pm


Our next unity service with First Baptist of West Point is December 1st. We will meet at FBCWP @ 10:30.

Please join us, we look forward to seeing you there.




It has been decided that with the busy holiday season upon us and so much going on in November and December, our Supper Club will take a break for November and December and resume in January 2025.

Foundational principles

We at the Fuller Center for Housing believe that: We are part of a God movement, and movements don't just stop. We have been called to this housing ministry; we didn't just stumble into it. We are unashamedly Christian, and enthusiastically ecumenical. We aren't a church but we are a servant of the Church. We are faith-driven, knowing that after we've done all we can do the Lord will help finish the job — something that requires us to stretch beyond our rational reach. We are a grass-roots ministry, recognizing that the real work happens on the ground in communities around the world through our covenant partners — so a large, overseeing bureaucracy isn't needed. We try to follow the teachings of the Bible and believe that it says that we shouldn't charge interest of the poor, so we don't. Government has a role in our work in helping set the stage, but that we shouldn't look to it as a means to fund the building of homes.
